

Jeremiah 32:27

Behold, I am the LORD, the God of all flesh. Is there anything too hard for Me?

There are so many things I can't do. For example, I can't swim (I can't even float), I can't have a baby (because I'm a man), I can't fly, I can't do algebra, I can't paint beautiful pictures on a blank canvas, and so on.

So does that mean I'm useless? No, just because I can't do everything, or that there are things that others can do that I can't do, does not make me useless, it just means I'm not God, and neither are you, that's why you can't do everything either. But God can!

† ***Behold, I am the LORD, the God of all flesh. Is there anything too hard for Me?***

God can do all those things I said I couldn't do, and He can do all the things that you can't do. In fact God not only can do them, but He also gave others the ability to do some of those things, but also chose not to give everyone the same abilities to do the same things. Like I said, I can't swim, and we just watched the Olympics a few weeks ago, and saw these amazing swimmers. Does that make them better than me because they can swim, and I can't? No, because I am sure there are things I can do that they can't do. I can play piano, but how many of them cannot. Once again it does not make me any better than them. But God (love those two words) has given us all different abilities, not so one can say I am better than you, but that with our different abilities, we can bring glory to God.

But you know what, there is something that you and I can do that God can't do.

But what we can do, that God can't do, is nothing to boast about.

I write this to give some of you those words of encouragement, knowing that you are not useless, and that God loves you and wants to use you with the things and abilities He has given you. Don't think others are better than you because you can't do what they do, but rather remember that there are things you can do that they can't do either.

I think of the leper who came to Jesus for healing, and I love the way he approached Jesus.

† **Matthew 8:2** *And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."*

And what was Jesus' response? "What you doubt me, no way am I going to heal you now."

No, that is not how Jesus responded at all,

† **Matthew 8:3** *Then Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, "**I am willing; be cleansed.**" Immediately his leprosy was cleansed.*

He knew Jesus could do anything and could heal him; he just wasn't sure if Jesus was willing to heal him. But we read that Jesus was willing to, and He did heal him.

So, next time you think of God or talk to Him, remember Who He is and that He can do ALL things, nothing is too hard for Him. All you have to do is ask Him.

It doesn't mean He will do it for you, but it also doesn't mean that He can't either.
