Philippians 1:3-4

I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy,

You think that sounds too crazy?

Tell that to Paul: *I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy,*
